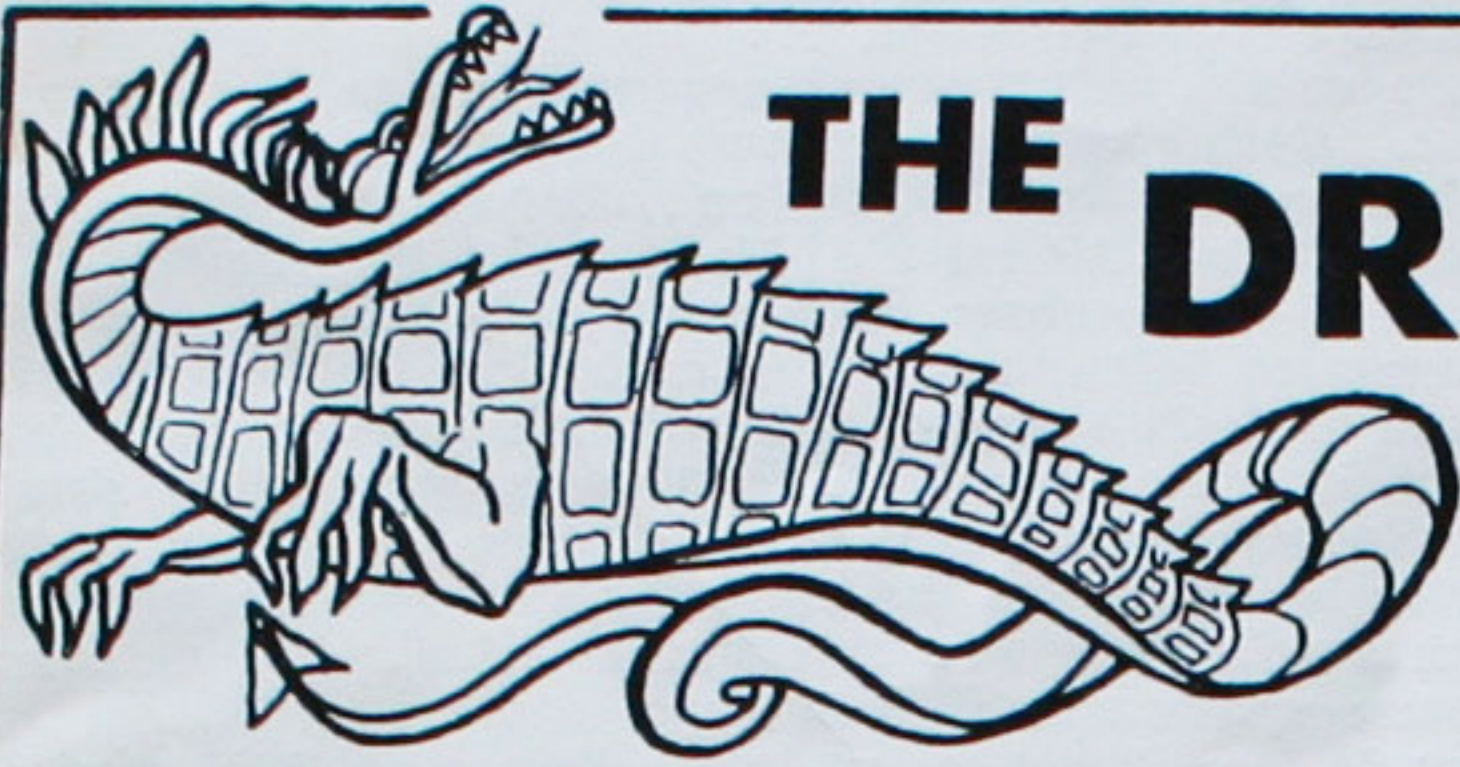

"Operation Santa's Sleigh" Reflects NHS Giving

"Operation Santa's Sleigh" saw the successful conclusion of Dragon's Roar's fourth annual pilgrimage to Hosanna-en last week when staffers loaded some 100 pounds of student-donated warm clothing, toys and shoes into bundles to deliver to Urawa City's Christian orphanage before the Yule vacation.

An appeal to classes throughout school also netted funds for the purchase or more than \$8 in new warm mittens and stockings for the waifs, who range in age from 20 months to 20 years. Staff members from sister-publication Sensus, student annual, made available \$10 as a special gift to aid in the purchase of winter clothing for the home's 44 youngsters. A church group in Culbertson, Nebr., sent over 70 pounds of cold weather clothing to help in the drive.

Located in an outlying area deep in Saitama Prefecture, the home is comprised of five austere-furnished halls and dormitories; news workers found kitchen employes preparing the noon meal for their charges with a cheerless winter wind nagging

at the unlit building from a dark day outside. On each little saucer-sized plate was a serving of cold Chinese cabbage and a scant portion of nato, pale brownish beans congealed as if to preserve a warmth they never had. When the little ones trouped in after a careful scrubbing they would be served a cup of green tea. There was no bread.

A caretaker stated the children plan a brief songfest at Christmas with a simple pageant during the day. He said a few students from a nearby Japanese high school sometimes appear at holiday time to distribute a small number of toys but that he was especially grateful to Narimasu citizens for their generosity in contributing urgently-needed clothing articles. The special purchases of American Christmas candy staffers brought was a special treat since institutionalized Japanese children almost never can be allowed the extravagance of sweets.

With a wet Tokyo winter still only in its first stages Dragon's Roar members are already making arrangements for another trip to the orphanage.

Later, Senior Superlatives personalities were introduced to the audience. These outstanding school citizens were picked for distinction in the annual by senior classmates.

Adagio dancers, local singing sensation Tony Estrade and a group of caroleers provided intermission entertainment.
